Read the following instructions before you begin writing.

1. The exam consists of two parts: Part I focuses on programming and Part II focuses on basic computer science analytical skills. You have 120 minutes to complete both parts.
2. Keep your writing material (pen, pencil, eraser), identity card, call letter(s), and possibly a water bottle with you. Keep everything else (including mobile phones, watches) away from you, at the place specified by the invigilators.
3. **Write your name and application id on every page immediately.** You will not get extra time to do this once the exam is over. **If you have applied for more than one program, pick any one of your application ids and write the same application id on all pages, for both papers.**
4. Answer only in the designated space with a clear handwriting in print script. Your answers will be scanned from the designated space and auto-graded. No additional space will be provided for writing answers. Answers written with a pencil are acceptable. The blank side of every sheet may be used for rough work. **Do not detach sheets.**
5. No clarifications will be given during the exams. If something is unclear or ambiguous, make reasonable assumptions and state them clearly. The exam organizing committee reserves the right to decide whether your assumptions were indeed reasonable.
6. **Any case of academic dishonesty on your part, including but not limited to copying others' answers and letting others copy yours, will lead to your disqualification and permanent blacklisting.**
7. As soon as the invigilators announce the end of exam, put down your pen, don't leave your place, don't speak a word; just follow the invigilators' instructions. Once all papers are collected and counts are tallied, the invigilators will allow you to get up. **Any violation of this instruction will lead to disqualification.**
